Criminal Justice – Pre–Service Program.</p> <p>Because law enforcement employment must be obtained within 1 year of successful completion of the MCOLES this agreement provides students with three options:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If a student desires to complete the Law Enforcement Program prior to pursuing their bachelor degree they may enroll in the B.S.C.D. program at a later date. 2. If a student desires to complete their bachelor degree prior to a career in law enforcement they may do so by completing all of the necessary courses and then enroll in the Criminal Justice – Pre-Service Program. Once this has been successfully completed the student will need to complete and submit their Prior Learning Portfolio in addition to their transcript to CMU. 3. JRN 350 Public Relations Principles and Practices MGT 312 Introduction to Management MGT 320 Human Resource Management MGT 348 Dynamics of Organizational Behavior</p> <p>Actual remaining requirements and semester hours are contingent upon courses taken in General Education at Kirtland Community College.</p> <p>To ensure that degree and graduation requirements will be satisfied, all remaining courses are to be selected in consultation with an advisor.</p> <p>Students are required to earn at least 124 semester hours in order to graduate from CMU. 60 semester hours must be from a regionally accredited 4-year degree granting institution or equivalent. 40 of the semester hours must be 300 level courses. A minimum of 30 semester hours of CMU residency credits are required.</p> <p>Minimum credits taken at CMU 32</p> |

* A grade of "C" (2.0) or better is required to satisfy competency requirements at CMU.

**Preferred course selection and required competency course.

***In order to receive Prior Learning credit the student must receive a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher and follow the guidelines in tab V of the Prior Learning Portfolio. Under the terms of this articulation agreement students will receive a reduced fee of \$35 per credit hour for Prior Learning credits granted.

****Prior Learning credit hours granted (UNV 297) will be equivalent to the credit hours taken at Kirtland Community College.
