A minimum of 30 semester hours of CMU residency credits are required.</p> <p>Minimum credits taken at CMU 30</p>

***In order to receive Prior Learning credit the student must receive a grade of "C" (2.0) or higher and follow the guidelines in tab V of the Prior Learning Portfolio. Under the terms of this articulation agreement students will receive a reduced fee of \$35 per credit hour for Prior Learning credits granted.

****Prior Learning credit hours granted (UNV 297) will be equivalent to the credit hours taken at Lansing Community College.
