To ensure that degree and graduation requirements will be satisfied, all remaining courses are to be selected in consultation with an advisor.</p> <p>Students are required to earn at least 124 semester hours in order to graduate from CMU. 60 semester hours must be from a regionally accredited 4-year degree granting institution or equivalent. 40 of the semester hours must be 300 level courses.
