Biology (except BIO-160 and BIOL-2110), ENVS-1050, NATS-1200, or NATS-1310 C. *Mathematics (1000 or above) Note: ENVS-1050 or NATS-1310 may fulfill either II.A or II.B, but not both.</p> <p><b>Group III (9-12)</b> A. One course in Economics, Geography, History, INTL-2010, INTL 2500, INTL 2700, Political Science (except POLS-1000), or SOSC-1010 B. One course in Anthropology, Psychology, Sociology, or SOSC-1010 C. POLS-1000, or HIST 2100 and HIST-2200 Note: Students may fulfill the requirements of both III.A and III.C by selecting HIST-2100 and HIST-2200. A minimum of 6 semester hours of electives must be at the 300 level or above.</p> <p><b>General Electives (9-41)</b> To be selected in consultation with an advisor to ensure that degree and graduation requirements will be satisfied.</p> <p>Students are required to earn at least 124 semester hours in order to graduate from CMU. 60 semester hours must be from a regionally accredited 4-year degree granting institution or equivalent. 40 of the semester hours must be 300 level courses.
