



## Academic year 09-10 Intermediate Level Education (ILE) and CMU’s Master of Science in Administration Degree

The U.S. Army Command & General Staff School offers intermediate level education to Army Officers as well as selected International Officers, Officers from Sister Services and interagency leaders. For Central Michigan University MSA students, a maximum of fifteen hours of transfer credit is available, depending on the student’s program. **This transfer credit award is available to students who take the ILE common core in resident or at “course locations.”**

To qualify for the maximum transfer credit, students must complete the ILE common core modules listed below with a “B” or a “P” in each module and have an overall GPA of 3.00 or better. **If the grade in one or more modules is below a “B”, partial credit will be considered.**

MSA 675: Strategic Policy Administration	MSA Administrative Core Course
MSA CRED: Operations Planning	Floating Elective on GA, HRA, or Leadership concentrations. Substitutes for PSC 566 on the PA concentration.
MSA CRED: Leadership	Can be used as a valid GA, HRA, or Leadership concentration course. Substitutes for PSC 785 on the PA concentration.
MSA CRED: Org Transformation	Can be used as a valid GA, HRA, or Leadership concentration course or as a floating elective on the PA concentration.
MSA CRED: Critical Reasoning	Can be used as a valid GA, HRA, or Leadership concentration course

**PA concentration** students may use 12 credits of ILE course work on the program plan. MSA 675 is used in the administrative core, MSA CRED: Org Transformation is used as the floating elective, MSA CRED: Leadership is approved as a substitute for PSC 785 and MSA CRED: Operations Planning is approved as a substitute for PSC 566. Therefore, PA students who plan to use ILE credit towards the MSA degree should not take PSC 785 and PSC 566.

As CAS<sup>3</sup> is no longer available, an additional 3 credits for an elective course or courses will be considered on a case by case basis. Please note that many electives are too military specific to apply to a degree in administration. Students should consult with their advisor and utilize the graduate transfer credit pre-approval process to determine if an additional 3 hours of transfer credit will be available to them. Some electives may be applicable to the International Administration concentration.
